- Birrarung Marr floating pontoon is closed to berthing and pedestrian access from 30 April 20 December 2024
- Angler's Tavern Jetty is closed to berthing and pedestrian access due to flood damage.

- Arbory Afloat is in place upstream of Evan Walker bridge.
- Yarra Botanica is in place alongside Sandridge Wharf.
- Shallow Waters Herring Island Meander has sediment build up creating shallow waters around the Island, please proceed with caution or avoid entering if unfamiliar with the area.
