

## 2. What other types of parks are there?

### Aim

This brainstorming session gives students an overview of the different types of parks.

### Materials

- Resource sheet 3: Victoria's public land.
- Workbook and pens.

### Activities

1. List 'parks' or 'reserves' you have visited or heard of that are not national parks. These might range from a small local park planted with ornamental trees and flowers within your town/city to large areas of native forest.

2. Group these parks under headings to reflect the type of park they are, e.g. municipal park, metropolitan park, regional park, state park, state forest, national park.

3. For each type of park you identified, list who mainly uses it and who manages it? Use the table below as a guide.

4. In which types of parks are people allowed to undertake the following activities?

- Walking their dogs.
- Camping.
- Trail bike riding.
- Horse riding.
- Playing football.
- Collecting firewood.
